






The History

- Special meeting at the spring scheduling meeting (03/17)



- White Paper Executive Recommendations:
 - 1. More consistent cruise planning approaches across ARF, especially regarding timing and communication protocols

 - 3. Operators strive for single POC
 - 4. More stream-lined approach for disseminating in-port costs
 - 5. Pls must stay on top of visa requirements
 - 6. Foreign Shipments must be well coordinated between PI, Operator, Freight Forwarder and Agent.
 - 7. UNOLS take lead on Best Practices/Cruise Planning documents.
