





Mariner experienced a toothache- seen ashore by dentist.

Mariner tested positive for COVID-19, isolated in room for 5 days.	
Mariner complained of a skin rash. Treated with advice from GWMMA.	
Mariner complained of a broken rib. Member leaned the ship's rail to assist with onboarding a science sensor package, at which point the package lifted clear of the water. The member was left holding a significant portion of the weight supported only by his ribs.	All should be reminded not to attempt to lift or support a package with their bodies, especially as the package passes through the water surface. Let the lifting devices do their job and only use boat poles or tag lines to control package as it is moved about the ship.
Mariner reported extreme sinus pain. Crewmember not fit for duty till return to port. Seen by doctor ashore and diagnosed with nerve pain.	
Mariner slipped off LARS.	
Mariner got a severe throat infection that was treated onboard and off the ship, treated off the ship as a P&I case.	



Remind crew of situational awareness and need to assess a job prior to commencing work (JSA if need)
Ensure that you maintain "one hand for you and one hand for the ship" when transiting the vessel.
New employees should be taught to slow down and safety comes first.
