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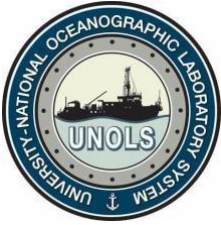
Incident Details	Warnings / Lessons Learned
Mariner exposed to chlorine dust when consolidating chlorine tablet buckets.	Do not consolidate chemicals that risk generating hazardous dust; wear proper PPE.
Main line became shock loaded after passing swell. Knocked swimmer off Alvin submersible. Compound fracture of hand and partially severed 5th digit	A thorough investigation of the swimmer incident is underway. All Alvin swimmer procedures are being reviewed and added training was provided to those participating.
Neck inflammation/swelling left neck of mariner. Communicated to GW by Tempus, resolved with antibiotics	
Mariner in pain from kidney stone flare up. Discussed condition with GW medical support. Patient provided pain killers and fluids. Patient on bed rest until he was taken off vessel on weather related port call.	
Mariner reported viral infection. Quarantined and provided fluids. Virus spread through ship crew. Symptoms included headache, fatigue and cough.	
Mariner experienced tooth pain while at sea.	
Mariner had infected abscess in his skin.	
Mariner had an ear infection.	
Mariner experienced a bout of nausea and poor digestion.	
A mariner caught their fingers in the watertight door of the engine room while the vessel was in heavy seas. Mariner was sent to shoreside medical for evaluation upon the vessel's return to port.	Ensure to maintain one hand for you and one for the ship. Ensure hatches/watertight doors are pinned properly, especially in heavy seas.
Crewmember opened an oven door and felt a piece of debris enter his right eye. Eye became itchy and irritated, not painful.	Instruct galley staff to step back or protect eyes and face upon opening an oven.



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Crewmember was lapping valves with continuous wrist rotations causing discomfort of right wrist.	Remind crewmembers to avoid over-working and over-stressing joints. Use efficient motion techniques and set up an ergonomic work environment.
Mariner complained of unexplainable pain in elbow and needed to see doctor.	
Crewmember complained of unexplainable pain in shoulder and needed to see doctor.	
Two mariners had ear infections.	
A mariner had anxiety issues.	
Crewmember had a gastrointestinal issue.	
Mariner had their hand caught pinch point of A-frame	
Mariner suffered from seasickness	
Mariner suffered Gastrointestinal distress	
Crewmember drilling out screw got metal bits in eye.	Wearing PPE is crucial to avoiding injury, even for simple & quick tasks
Laceration of little finger. Crewmember cut finger loading a black trash bag onto the trash wire basket.	Always put work gloves on to throw away trash. Training was provided to crew.
Right thumb injury -crewmember was breaking bolts on the roller door to the CTD hangar with a wrench. The bolt was in a tight area between the rail and frame of the roller door. When the bolt released his right thumb was pinched between the wrench and the roller door frame.	Crewmember who had thumb injury was wearing appropriate work gloves which saved his hand from serious injury.
Mariner injured with pipe wrench while working on overhead hydraulic lines in the engine room. Individual had a cut on inside his lip and a bruised cheek.	



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Mariner out for week with cold/virus.	
Crewmember had lower abdominal pain, became nauseated and started vomiting. Cause unknown.	
Mariner had gastrointestinal distress	Tell the crew to wash their hands.
Mariner chipped a tooth	Tell the crew to be careful when eating harder than usual foods.
Mariner injured their ankle ashore	Tell the crew to be careful while walking in stairways.
Mariner broke their ankle (happened while biking ashore)	Tell the crew to be careful when engaging in sports ashore such as skateboarding and biking.
Crewmember had a hernia that occurred during reaching to a valve handle	
Mariner fell while ashore and broke their collarbone
