Use food grade mineral oil, Drakeol-35 or similar. It is non-toxic, non-hazardous, and will not decompose the components, wiring or transducer cover.. If you have someone there, such as at Eric Firing's group with DSPL SeaBatteries, the fluid used in the SeaBattery is Drakeol-35.
